Active Shooter data - Confrontation ONLY

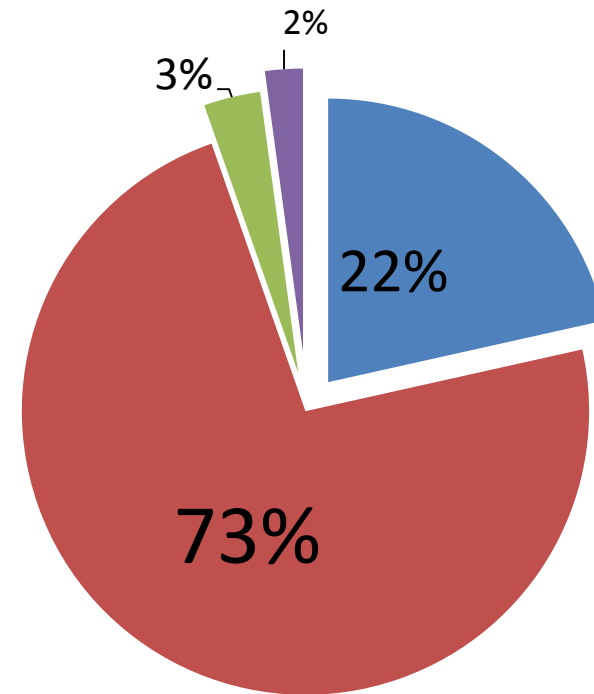

73% **Patrol** - Officers in the area, plain clothes, dispatched personnel

22% **Citizen** - Security, Public, retired officers

3% **SWAT** - **NO** examples of SWAT ending an Active Shooter situation. They were called out to a resulting hostage/barricaded situation.

2% **Unknown** - not enough information to identify



Suicide - Offender took their own life prior or during Police attendance.

No Force - Offender surrendered to Police, without a confrontation, shortly after the shootings or in a later investigation.

Escaped - Offender eluded Police and has not been caught

Over 95% of Active Shooter situations, where a confrontation occurred, were dealt with by First Responders!
